Critical Connections Our Planet Digital Storytelling Festival 2023







Welcome to the 'Our Planet Digital Storytelling Festival 2023' which is hosted at Goldsmiths, University of London and brings together digital stories from around the globe. We are celebrating the eleventh year of The Critical Connections project and we are delighted that some lead educators and schools have been with us from the start and others have joined along the way.

The young filmmakers have explored the theme of 'Our Planet' in imaginative, critical, and radical ways engaging with research, stories, poetry, and artwork to create their multilingual films.

As well as focusing on environmental issues these films tell stories about our roots, our homes, our emotions, and ways to connect and be hopeful. The festival shares the stories these young filmmakers have told about their local and global communities and their futures.

There are 27 languages included in the digital stories and lead educators have worked with young participants (6 - 18 years old) across 21 educational institutions (primary, secondary, community-based complementary) and 8 countries (Australia, Cyprus, England, Germany, India, Italy, Malaysia and Taiwan). There will be short inperson presentations at the festival or pre-recorded introductions or slides before each film.

The secondary school Herz Jesu Institut in Mühlbach / Rio di Pusteria in Italy, is the first climate school in our country. We have a climate team and HJI Greenfluencer who are in charge of implementing ideas and projects by pupils to protect the environment. They also created embroidered T-shirts with green slogans and they regularly post messages and photographs on important climate issues on social media.

We have participated in the 'Critical Connections Project 2022-2023' project and 'Our planet festival 2023' organised by Goldsmiths University of London with a multilingual film called 'Wurzeln Radici Roots'. In our school there are 150 pupils aged 11 to 13, who speak German dialect, Standard German, Italian, Ladin, Spanish, English and many other languages.

We wanted to explore the roots in nature, the roots of our language and family, as well as our artistic and musical roots.

The film is a reflection on our roots. Where do we come from? Where does our language come from? What am I good at and how can I express myself? Where is my expression rooted in? What are the roots in nature? How can we get to the root of a problem? We also investigated the use of the noun and verb "root" in languages that are spoken in our school.



The aphorisms were developed after students saw photos connected with wise sayings. Each student then brought an object to inspire them to write lyrics/quotes about planet earth (environment, nature, people, behaviour). Then they tried to write a quote looking at their object and connecting it with real life. Students had the opportunity to transform their quotes. They also chose a hero that would narrate their quote (Playmobil, doll, shell, teddy bear etc). The students also read quotes of well-known Greek poets such as Odysseas Elytis, ancient Greek philosopher, Aristotle and others such as Einstein, Tolstoy etc. Finally, the scenario of their film consisted of 21 philosophical quotes in relation to nature, mother Earth, peoples' attitudes towards the environment and animals all placed in a specific order by the students.
